STORY TIPS

THEME The central issue in our lives that shows the contrast in our spiritual outlook before and after knowing Christ. **MIDDLE HANDLE** We need to keep it simple, clear, and repeatable.

CONCLUSION End with a question or statement that requires a response.

SCRIPTURE Think of whether there was one key verse that really opened your eyes. If not, do not force it. **LANGUAGE** Avoid religious clichés and "God-talk".

LENGTH Be brief and to the point (3-4 minutes).

SEQUENCE With practice you will be able to start and end at any one of the handles, depending on the situation. **PUTTING OTHERS FIRST** Keep your focus on your friend. Emphasize those aspects of your story that will relate to *his* or *her* concerns and interests.

Next Step: I will formulate and be able to tell "My Story" in 3-4 minutes, in a way that others can relate to.
